This course offers students the opportunity to experience, first hand, the amazing paintings, sculptures, and architecture of the Renaissance in the very places the movement was born.

Daytrips included to sites outside Florence and Rome, as well as visits to many outstanding places of interest within the cities themselves. These include trips to Pisa, Assisi, and Siena, and excursions to important museums and art pieces scattered throughout the cities.

The class will meet on campus the week prior to the trip to Italy, and each day the two weeks following the return to Norfolk. Participants will complete assigned readings throughout the course, and write a research paper, accompanied with a brief presentation.

▲ Students must register and pay for ARTH 495 (undergraduate) or ARTH 595 (graduate) (3 credits, spring registration 2010) in order to participate in this program. Prerequisites: ARTH 211, ARH 212 OR permission from instructor.

Cost includes: Roundtrip airfare from/to Norfolk, airport transfers, accommodations (double or triple rooms; single supplement extra, if available), tours and guides as indicated on itinerary, transportation for activities, health insurance, study abroad fee

Not included: ODU tuition for 3 credits (participants are required to register for credits), meals other than those indicated above, transport other than those indicated above, expenses of a personal nature.



***ODU Scholarships:** Dean's Education Abroad Awards are available for the first 12 qualified students accepted for this program. *Eligibility:* Full-time ODU student, 2.5 GPA or higher, approval of participation by the Office of Study Abroad and the program's faculty leader.

Applications available from the Office of Study Abroad. Deadline for scholarship application for this program is February 15, 2010. *If you are eligible, the scholarship award will be credited to your student account in late January or early February, prior to the departure of the program. The Office of Study Abroad handles these arrangements and will notify you via email. If you do not owe the university any money a refund check will be issued by the Office of Finance and mailed to your address from LEO Online.*

Estimated cost without scholarship: \$3,650.

For some students, regular student financial aid support can be increased due to the additional cost of studying abroad. See the Office of Study Abroad for a program budget and referral to Student Financial Aid staff who assist study abroad students.

Payment Schedule: \$250 deposit upon application; half of remaining total due on February 15, 2010, and the other half on March 26, 2010.
